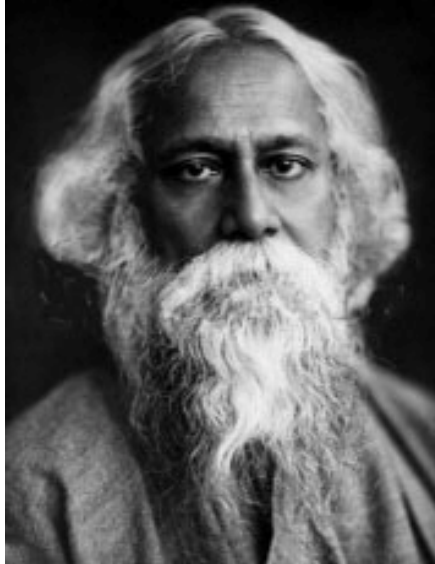


A Tribute to Tagore

Rabindranath Tagore (1861-1941) has been a towering figure in Bengal as a writer, playwright, poet, philosopher and an educator, but is best remembered for his songs. He won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1913 for the English version of his collection of Bengali poems, 'Gitanjali' (Song Offerings). Tagore received honours and recognition from all over the world for the expression of all

possible tenets of human characters and emotions through literature. He founded a school in 1901 to combine the best of traditional Indian education with Western ideals which has now expanded to include a well-known University, named the Visva Bharati. To this day, he remains one of the most inspiring cultural figures in India, Bangladesh and abroad.
